

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SWF FY10 CT Actions

- 40 FY 10 Contract Actions
 - ▶ Includes 8 Contract Actions for National Defense Authorization Act
 - Pending approval this quarter



Significant Issues

- Taskers from COS Management Board, Feb 2-3
 - ▶ Ensure COS requirements are included in District's Human Capital Plan (Campaign Plan 4.d.)
 - Submissions required by the end of the month
 - ▶ Provide Mr. Dalton information on COS size and staffing. Are we sized right for mission – present and future?
 - Present- SWF COS Office is sized appropriately
 - Future- Based on the current FYDP, the SWF COS will need additional facility types or roles to maintain current strength
 - ▶ Provide Mr. Dalton information on how the COS's are helping with technical competency in the Corps
 - The SWF COS feels it is helping with the technical competency in the Corps
 - ▷ Engineering is completing Adapt-Build designs in-house staff
 - ▷ Leveraging other Districts to complete an Adapt-Build designs
 - ▷ Incorporating “off-shelf” energy technology into Adapt-Build projects
 - ▶ Recommend a FY 11 or 12 Adapt-Build project as a demonstration project for the “Whole Building Design” team
 - Recommend using an FY 12 AIT B/COF at Ft Sill, OK



Significant Issues

- Mr. James Dalton's Remarks at COSMB
 - ▶ More positive comments and perspectives coming from the field regarding the COS program
 - ▶ COSs should be leveraging new technologies from CERL, ERDC, Industry, etc. & incorporate into products
 - ▶ Repetitive tasks and operations should be standardized and implemented into production centers
 - All USACE Districts can't be "full service"
 - ▶ Expand in-house design to execute non-standard facilities
 - ▶ COS should be the model for how the Corps captures and implements Lessons Learned
 - Lessons Learned should be captured in ELL system
 - ▷ Critical to capture data that changes policy or facility requirements
 - ▶ Energy & sustainability issues will become a significant matter for future MILCON projects



Contracting Issues

■ Regional Contracts

- ▶ Establishing New Contracts for StarShip Renovations & Warehouses (2 Contracts/ 16 Task Orders through 2015)
- ▶ Establishing New MATOC's for Existing Facility Types (12 Contracts)

■ Working Protests

- ▶ Solicitation No. W9126G-09-R-0009 (Fort Belvoir Barracks Task Order) Task Order No. 0002
 - GAO protest at GAO filed. On advice of Counsel, KO taking corrective action, expect GAO to dismiss as academic. Possibility of follow-on protest.
